Halloween Costumes & Candy (*NEW):

Each classroom teacher will communicate with students and families if costumes are allowed at school. If so, please ensure that there are no toy weapons attached to the costume, that shoes are supportive for recess and/or PE, and that there are no masks, as we need to visibly see each child's face (except for the mandatory face mask).

Also, we respectfully ask that you send your child with no more than ONE small piece of candy in his/her lunch only. This small piece of candy can supplement his/her school lunch.

Individual Picture Retakes (*NEW):

If your child missed our Leo's individual picture day, Leo's will be back for picture retake day on October 29th.

Bus Behavior & Bus COVID Requirements (*NEW):

If your child rides the school bus, please remind him/her to wear a mask and sit in his/her assigned seat on the bus. Both of those actions can help limit COVID-19 exposure on the bus. When students follow these rules, they also reduce the chance of missing school. When someone diagnosed with the virus rides a school bus, staff must investigate whether anyone near them is considered a close contact.

If clear bus video footage is not available, as there are cameras on all buses, and the assigned seating chart has not been followed with fidelity, the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department considers everyone on the bus a close contact and requires them to quarantine.

Our goal with these bus rules is to keep students and drivers safe and reduce the number of days students miss school. The rules are enforced similar to other bus behavior requirements.

4th & 5th graders will take the math and ELA SBA test in October, per state requirements. This will include one day of math and one day of ELA testing for each grade. Here are our upcoming SBA testing days for 4th & 5th grades:

**Make-ups will be the week of October 25th for any students absent last week's two days of testing Please help us with the following to ensure your child does his/her best on the test:

- Bring his/her charged TPS laptop and charger
- Be on time for school
- Get a good night's sleep
- Eat a good breakfast
- Positive self-talk
 - Take your time
 - Check your work
 - o Persevere
 - Read the directions and passages multiple times
 - Use scratch paper to solve the problems, look for errors, and show thinking
 - o Listen carefully to the directions on the computer and from the teacher
 - o Use the tools appropriately (computer, headphones, pencil, scratch paper, etc.)
 - Stay focused
 - Do your best on the test!

Clothing & Inclement Weather (*UPDATED):

Please do your best to send your child to school each day with clothing based on the projected weather, as we start seeing our weather change. Also, please write your child's name on the clothing so we can ensure it stays with the appropriate student. We do our best to get students outside for recess, and do not have a covered area here at McKinley, so thank you in advance for planning appropriately.

Also, please try your best to have your child wear appropriate shoes for PE and recess.

When to Keep Your Child Home:

TPS would like to share the following expectations to continue doing our best to keep our entire school community healthy. If your child has ANY of these symptoms, he/she should stay home from school:

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Cough
- Loss of taste or smell
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Muscle or body aches
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

When they can return to school is based on their specific symptoms. Please visit our district website: www.tacomaschools.org to find a guide to when to safely send your child back to school.

TPS Is Now Hiring! (*UPDATED):

The school district is now offering \$250-\$5,000 hiring bonuses to fill key positions:

- Nurses (\$5,000)
- LPNs (\$3,500 for licensed)
- Bus drivers (\$3,500 for CDL Class B certified, \$2,500 for non-CDL Class B certified)
- Paraeducators (\$500)
- Bus monitors (\$500)
- Nutrition services (\$500). No high school diploma or GED required. District offering incentives to obtain GED.
- Noon-hour supervisors (\$250)
- School support / contract tracing (\$250)
- We are also looking for emergency substitute teachers and have changed the requirements so that more people are temporarily eligible. Substitute pay has also increased to \$200 per day.

Late Start Wednesdays:

Our Wednesday 1-hour late start schedule has started. On these days, school will start at 10 AM and there will be no supervision prior to 9:50 AM. Bus routes will be delayed by one hour.

Volunteers:

We are ready and pleased to welcome volunteers back in schools. As always, volunteers must participate in a screening and background check, which needs to be completed annually. They must also follow all health and safety guidelines, including wearing a mask and social distancing. <u>And this year, volunteers must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and show proof of that vaccination.</u>

The new vaccine requirement includes two potential exemptions - a qualifying medical exemption or sincerely held religious exemption. If you are seeking an exemption to volunteer, please see how to do that at www.tacomaschools.org or in the district's Sunday newsletter from 9/12/21.

Student COVID Testing Now Available:

Starting September 20th, students who show symptoms of COVID-19 in school can take a free, voluntary test to confirm whether they have the virus. Parents/guardians must give permission for their child to take the test. Results will be reported back to you and the school within 24-48 hours, at which time appropriate quarantine and contact tracing protocols can start, if needed.

To keep others healthy, please keep your child home if they are sick, have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, or have tested positive for COVID-19.

Student Learning During Quarantine:

Students who cannot attend school because they have COVID-19 or are required to quarantine will learn from home using lessons and support materials provided by their teachers.

TPS has developed learning plans for various remote-learning scenarios - including small groups or entire classes - for students missing in-person school for up to $14\ days$.

Immunizations & Vaccinations:

More free school immunization and COVID-19 vaccination opportunities are now open to you and your family. It is so important to get those school immunizations complete. If your child received immunizations over the summer, make sure to update our school nurse. Students without required immunizations or a valid exemption will not be allowed to attend school, as the law requires.

A COVID-19 vaccine is not required for students to attend school, but they are available for free to those 12 and up, and that includes students and families. Get more details on our website or in that Sunday newsletter on 9/12/21.

Contact Tracing Process:

Our district works in partnership with the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department to conduct contact tracing to determine if anyone may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19. The health department determines who is a close contact and gives specific dates for isolation or quarantining and returning to school. The district then provides the school COVID supervisor, with communications to notify the family of the student who is deemed a close contact.

* Close contacts who are fully vaccinated are not required to quarantine unless they are symptomatic. They are encouraged to get tested 3-5 days after exposure. If your child is identified as a close contact



and is vaccinated, you must show proof of vaccination to your school to return to school.

Close contacts who are NOT fully vaccinated are required by the health department to stay home for a total of 14 days past the date of exposure. If you choose to have your child tested before they experience any symptoms and the test is negative, they must still quarantine for the entire 14-day period.

Those who are not close contacts but have been in the same classroom or workspace as someone who is COVID positive, are also provided notifications when there is a positive case. Additionally, <u>TPS also publishes information on the district website each time there is a COVID case in a school or district office.</u>

Before & After School Camp Registration:

MetroParks Before and After School Camp Registration for November 1st-December 17th will be available on October 7th for currently registered families. Registration will be open to the public on Monday, October 11th. Registration will close on Wednesday, October 20th.

- MetroParks Before and After School Camp Sites are Arlington, Lyon, Fern Hill, Larchmont, and Reed.
- Please note that rates have changed on our registration to reflect the 7-week session (This is based on our monthly rates of \$450 for full time care and \$225 for part-time care).
 - o Full time Camp AM/PM Mon-Fri- \$675 (7-week camp)
 - o Part Time Camp- AM ONLY Mon-Fri \$338 (7-week camp)
 - o Part Time Camp- PM ONLY Mon-Fri \$375 (7-week camp)
- Please note that MetroParks Before and After School Camps will be CLOSED on the following days:
 - o November 11th-Veteran's Day
 - o November 24th-26th -Thanksgiving Break
 - December 6th -Trimester Break
 - o December 20th January 2nd- Winter Break
- Families can apply for financial assistance and receive up to 75% off our rates. Families must complete the application and be approved <u>BEFORE</u> registering for camp. Forms can be emailed to reg.support@tacomaparks.com.

Drop-Off/Pick-Up & Bus Zone:

It is important, for the safety of all, and to be cognizant to the McKinley neighbors, to follow these important drop-off / pick-up expectations:

- There will be no supervision in the morning prior to 8:50 AM on M/T/Th/F. On Wednesdays, no supervision prior to 9:50 AM.
- Drop-off and pick-up will occur on E 37th Street **to the north of the school**. Please follow the cones, signs, and staff direction, as there is no parking on E. 37th Street (directly north of the school) or on the curb closest to the school on E. McKinley Ave., as that is where our busses will pick-up/drop-off.
- E. McKinley Ave. (on the school side) will be for busses **only.** Please do not drop-off, pick-up, or park here.
- The only crosswalk will be on the corner of E. 37th Street & E. McKinley Ave. Please adhere to direction of the crossing guard at this location.
- School is out each day at 3:30 PM.

- Drop off and pick up students on E. 37th St. (Blue X)
- Don't park on E. 37th St. Please follow the cones and signage placed on E. 37th St. during drop off and pick up times.
- Avoid dropping off or picking up your student in the front of the building on E. McKinley Ave. This area is reserved for buses only.
