#### **Incoming Kindergarten Registration for the 2021-22 School Year:**

Do you have a child who will be in kindergarten for the 2021-22 school year, or know of someone who does? If so, please fill out an enrollment application online in March, so we can ensure we have accurate staffing for the 2021-22 school year. The challenges and changes this past year have made planning difficult, but now is the time to enroll for kindergarten in the fall. We have space for you.

Each spring, Tacoma Public Schools looks at enrollment for the following year to determine how many teachers and support staff are needed. Enrolling now also helps students and families prepare for the transition to kindergarten. Each elementary school invites incoming kindergarten students to participate in Jumpstart events at their school during the summer.

#### How to enroll (please note first-time users will create an account):

#### **Spring Break (\*NEW):**

The Tacoma Public Schools spring break this year is April 5<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup>. We will resume classes the following week on April 12<sup>th</sup>. Enjoy your spring break, have fun, and stay safe!

#### Tacoma's TV School Expands to Include Grades 4 & 5 Plus Science Lessons:

As students shift to hybrid learning, daily routines are changing and students in grades 3-5 have more independent learning time. Beginning March 15th, Tacoma's TV Classroom lessons will be available for K-5 students focusing on science and social-emotional learning. All lessons align with classroom curriculum.

Each week, Tacoma teachers Ms. Walle and Ms. Ozolin will teach 16 total lessons. Lessons focus on science and social-emotional activities by grade level. Science lessons will integrate both ELA and math to support and align with Mystery Science lessons used in the classroom. Social-emotional lessons follow the Getting Along Together (GAT) curriculum.

Lessons will continue to air daily on the KTPS TV (Comcast Channel 26 or Click/Rainier Connect Channel 25) or anytime on the TPS TV Classroom YouTube channel: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCsssmvcrDx0Wwid Rt7ALiw.

TV School started last fall primarily to serve younger students in grades K-3 who did not have a computer or internet access at home. Through television, those students could stay connected to regular, entertaining, educational lessons tied to their developmental levels. This new expansion for grades 4-5 will supplement the instruction students in those grades need for the rest of the school year as they shift to part-time in-person instruction and less remote learning. K-2 students attend school in person four days per week. Grade

3 students attend school in person two days a week in cohorts; grades 4 and 5 will do so starting March 15 and 22, respectively.

Due to space limitations, grades 3-5 will continue in cohorts through the end of the school year. The TPS TV Classroom will continue to offer K-5 lessons through the end of the school year.

#### Meals:

- Meal packs can get picked up for the first time at elementary schools from 11:30 AM to 12:30 PM; look for signs outside for the pick-up location, which will be on the north end cafeteria door.
- Meal packs can get picked up at middle schools from 10 AM to 12 PM; the pick-up locations will not change.
- Times and stops for the Meals-on-Wheels meal delivery program in neighborhoods have changed significantly. The new map and schedule are online at www.tacomaschools.org/nutrition.

MEALS MON-FRI

On students' in-person learning days, they will receive their meals in school.

Free breakfasts and lunches will continue to be available to all children up to 18 years old, through the end of the school year, whether students are learning from home or in a school building.

If your child has a food allergy, please also let Mrs. Jones know. We want to do all we can to safely feed our students. Our Nutrition Services team can provide some food substitutes— such as soy milk–for medically necessary needs, but only if families provide a doctor's note, and only on the days that student is learning inperson at our school.

#### Laptops:

When students attend school in-person, their teachers will let students and families know when to bring their laptops to school. When they do bring them, students should wrap or cover their devices and make sure the laptops are carried in a bag or backpack. Students will need to bring their laptops home at night to charge the battery.

#### **Transportation:**

If you are wondering how and when your child can ride the bus to and from school on their in-person learning days, you can get that information on our website. #### Fawcett Replacement Project Update:

Great news! The Tacoma Public School Board selected the team of Tacoma-based BLRB Architects and Hensel Phelps Construction Co. to design and build the new Fawcett Elementary School. Fawcett is one of 8 school replacements or historic renovations funded by the \$535 million school construction bond voters passed in 2020.

The new Fawcett Elementary is expected to open in 2023. While our new school is under construction, Fawcett students will attend school at the former McKinley Elementary. Fawcett staff and students will use the former McKinley Elementary School campus for the next two school years, as our new school is built.

This spring, we will start packing up our spaces in preparation for the move to McKinley in June. McKinley is at 3702 East McKinley Avenue. Transportation will be provided for students living in the current Fawcett boundary.


