## Get Help Learning to Talk to Children About Racism & Police Violence (\*NEW):

On April 20<sup>th</sup>, a jury convicted former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin of the May 2020 murder of George Floyd in a highly publicized national case. This news, and the issues and feelings surrounding it, can be difficult for children to understand or process.

If you would like some resources that can help you have age-appropriate conversations about the verdict, racism, and police violence, please take a look at the district's newsletter emailed to you on Sunday, April 25<sup>th</sup>.

### Apply for Free or Reduced-Price Meals:

If you have not already applied for free or reduced-price meals, please consider it. Meals are free for all our students this year, but there are many benefits associated with being eligible for free or reduced-priced meals.

For example, children eligible for free or reduced-price meals are automatically qualified to receive "Pandemic EBT" grocery benefits worth hundreds of dollars per child. Newly qualifying families will receive grocery benefits retroactive to September and more dollars will be added through the summer, as well. Qualifying families can also access other services, like discounted Internet broadband. Our school also receives additional funding based on the number of students who qualify.

If you were not eligible at the beginning of the school year, but your situation has changed, you may now be eligible. Find a link to the application at www.tacomaschools.org/nutrition or the TPS newsletter sent via email on April 18<sup>th</sup>.

### Family App (IMPORTANT!):

## IMPORTANT: COVID SURVEY REQUIRED BEFORE 9 AM EVERY DAY YOUR CHILD ATTENDS SCHOOL IN PERSON!

You will need the Family App to fill out the DAILY health survey every day your child comes to school. This is

a critical step in our safety protocols and is required daily. Your child will not be able to attend class until this is completed each morning.

## Health & Safety at School:

Thank you to all of our families who are helping keep our entire student body and our staff healthy. Let's keep it up. Every day you send your child to in-person learning, please remind them to wear their mask, wash their hands frequently, and maintain physical distancing.

Please keep your child home when they're not feeling well. Please call the main office to let us know if this is the case, so we can ensure your child's absence is reported accurately. Completing the COVID-19 daily health survey every day your child is scheduled to attend school is an easy way to note whether they should attend school.





## Social Distancing:

For the remainder of this school year, all of our schools will stick with 6 feet of social distancing across the whole school.

You may have seen in the news that the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and our state Health Department issued some new guidance that would allow students to be as close as 3 feet apart in classrooms.

However, the change does not apply to staff members, and it does not apply to students when they are in common areas, like the lunchroom or gym. So for consistency and the health and safety of students, all our schools will continue with 6 feet social distancing.

## Incoming Kindergarten Registration for the 2021-22 School Year:

Do you have a child who will be in kindergarten for the 2021-22 school year, or know of someone who does? If so, please fill out an enrollment application online in March, so we can ensure we have accurate staffing for the 2021-22 school year. The challenges and changes this past year have made planning difficult, but now is the time to enroll for kindergarten in the fall. We have space for you.

Each spring, Tacoma Public Schools looks at enrollment for the following year to determine how many teachers and support staff are needed. Enrolling now also helps students and families prepare for the transition to kindergarten. Each elementary school invites incoming kindergarten students to participate in Jumpstart events at their school during the summer.

## How to enroll (please note first-time users will create an account):

The Tacoma Public Schools enrollment application is online at: <u>New Student Enrollment (Pre-K-12) - Tacoma</u> <u>Public Schools (tacomaschools.org)</u>, but there are a few things you'll need before logging in:

- Two documents to verify your address
- Student vaccination records
- A birth certificate for students entering school for the first time

## Masks:

When you send your child to school, please ensure his/her mask has two layers. Generally speaking, the blue and white disposable or "surgical" masks have two layers. Not all cloth masks have two layers. Wearing either a double-layered mask or two single-layer masks meets the most recent health guidance.

## Meals:

- Meal packs can get picked up for the first time at elementary schools from 11:30 AM to 12:30 PM; look for signs outside for the pick-up location, which will be on the north end cafeteria door.
- Meal packs can get picked up at middle schools from 10 AM to 12 PM; the pick-up locations will not change.
- Times and stops for the Meals-on-Wheels meal delivery program in neighborhoods have changed significantly. The new map and schedule are online at www.tacomaschools.org/nutrition.

On students' in-person learning days, they will receive their meals in school.

Free breakfasts and lunches will continue to be available to all children up to 18 years old, through the end of the school year, whether students are learning from home or in a school building.

If your child has a food allergy, please also let Mrs. Jones know. We want to do all we can to safely feed our students. Our Nutrition Services team can provide some food substitutes- such as soy milk-for medically necessary needs, but only if families



provide a doctor's note, and only on the days that student is learning in-person at our school.

## **Transportation:**

If you are wondering how and when your child can ride the bus to and from school on their in-person learning days, you can get that information on our website. ## Fawcett Replacement Project Update:

Great news! The Tacoma Public School Board selected the team of Tacoma-based BLRB Architects and Hensel Phelps Construction Co. to design and build the new Fawcett Elementary School. Fawcett is one of 8 school replacements or historic renovations funded by the \$535 million school construction bond voters passed in 2020.

The new Fawcett Elementary is expected to open in 2023. While our new school is under construction, Fawcett students will attend school at the former McKinley Elementary. Fawcett staff and students will use the former McKinley Elementary School campus for the next two school years, as our new school is built.

This spring, we will start packing up our spaces in preparation for the move to McKinley in June. McKinley is at 3702 East McKinley Avenue. Transportation will be provided for students living in the current Fawcett boundary.

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## **Falcon Foundations for Success:**


