We have been working hard to plan a COVID-19 safe 5th grade celebration for our wonderful 5th graders. Please make sure to read this email in its entirety for all of the information we have at this time!

When: Wednesday June 9th from 1-3 PM. Students will need to be dropped off and picked up for this celebration, no busses will be available for transportation. Parents/guardians will also need to fill out the COVID-19 survey for their child on this day, as well. Unfortunately, parents/guardians are unable to attend due to COVID-19 restrictions and protocols.

Where: Fawcett Elementary! Students will need to be dropped off and enter through the gym as they normally would. Please do not drop off students any earlier than 1PM, as there will be no supervision.

Donations: At this time, we will be providing T-shirts, pizza, and ice cream/popsicles for our 5th graders. If you would like to donate any other items, please make sure they are individually wrapped and store-bought items; items such as chips or drinks. There are about 42 students.

Survey on Spending Stimulus Funds (*NEW):

Tacoma Public Schools has received some federal stimulus funds to help students impacted by the pandemic. This funding is given out to school districts one time only and can be spent during a specific time period.

We'd like to hear from you about what kind of things you believe these funds should help address. Be on the lookout for an email from the district with a link to the survey. The information you share will help us develop our spending plan. The survey closes Sunday, May 23rd.

Full-Time Instruction:

Tacoma Public Schools plans to offer full time in-person instruction five days per week for ALL students next year. Five days of in-person learning won't necessarily look like it did before the pandemic. We will keep you up to date with state health and safety guidelines, so you know what to expect in the fall. As always, the health and safety of students and staff is our highest priority.

For families who do not want their child to attend school in person, we offer Tacoma Online for grades K-12. Tacoma Online will operate as a stand-alone school for the 2021-2022 school year. Students enrolling in Tacoma Online will not have any other assigned school, like they do this year.

Free Meals in 2021-22 School Year & Other Meals Updates:

It was announced this week that all TPS students will receive free meals next school year. We still ask families to apply for free or reduced-price meals for this school year if they haven't already. Families who qualify can receive many benefits, including automatically qualifying to receive funds to buy groceries.

Pandemic EBT cards providing grocery benefits for the current school year are still being mailed. If you have not received your card by mid-May, call the P-EBT Contact Center at 833-518-0282.

Laptops:

All students returning to Tacoma Public Schools in the fall can keep their district-issued laptops over the summer. Seniors and students transferring out of the district will need to return their laptop to their school later this year.

Keeping the devices over the summer will allow students to stay engaged with their learning. An example would be with i-Ready reading and math lessons. Students will have access to the same digital tools as during the school year, including Office 365, Teams, and any apps they used for classroom work. No features will be turned off during the summer.



Ways to Get Involved & Give Input on Next Year's School Budget:

Tacoma Public Schools is currently working on the budget for the 2021-22 school year, which will be adopted this summer by the Board of Directors. There are a few ways for you to get involved and provide input.

First, TPS is currently looking for volunteers to serve on the Budget Advisory Committee.

Second, you can use the district's budget calculator to provide input on how you would allocate funds to different programs.

Family App (IMPORTANT!):

IMPORTANT: COVID SURVEY REQUIRED BEFORE 9 AM EVERY DAY YOUR CHILD ATTENDS SCHOOL IN PERSON!

You will need the Family App to fill out the DAILY health survey every day your child comes to school. This is a critical step in our safety protocols and is required daily.

Your child will not be able to attend class until this is completed each morning.

Health & Safety at School:

Thank you to all of our families who are helping keep our entire student body and our staff healthy. Let's keep it up. Every day you send your child to in-person learning, please remind them to wear their mask, wash their hands frequently, and maintain physical distancing.

Please keep your child home when they're not feeling well. Please call the main office to let us know if this is the case, so we can ensure your child's absence is reported accurately. Completing the COVID-19 daily health survey every day your child is scheduled to attend school is an easy way to note whether they should attend school.

Meals:

- ☼ Meal packs can get picked up for the first time at elementary schools from 11:30 AM to 12:30 PM; look for signs outside for the pick-up location, which will be on the north end cafeteria door.
- ☼ Meal packs can get picked up at middle schools from 10 AM to 12 PM; the pick-up locations will not change.
- ☼ Times and stops for the Meals-on-Wheels meal delivery program in neighborhoods have changed significantly. The new map and schedule are online at www.tacomaschools.org/nutrition.

On students' in-person learning days, they will receive their meals in school.



Free breakfasts and lunches will continue to be available to all children up to 18 years old, through the end of the school year, whether students are learning from home or in a school building.

If your child has a food allergy, please also let Mrs. Jones know. We want to do all we can to safely feed our students. Our Nutrition

Services team can provide some food substitutes– such as soy milk–for medically necessary needs, but only if families provide a doctor’s note, and only on the days that student is learning in-person at our school.



Transportation:

If you are wondering how and when your child can ride the bus to and from school on their in-person learning days, you can get that information on our website. Fawcett Replacement Project Update:

Great news! The Tacoma Public School Board selected the team of Tacoma-based BLRB Architects and Hensel Phelps Construction Co. to design and build the new Fawcett Elementary School. Fawcett is one of 8 school replacements or historic renovations funded by the \$535 million school construction bond voters passed in 2020.

The new Fawcett Elementary is expected to open in 2023. While our new school is under construction, Fawcett students will attend school at the former McKinley Elementary. Fawcett staff and students will use the former McKinley Elementary School campus for the next two school years, as our new school is built.

This spring, we will start packing up our spaces in preparation for the move to McKinley in June. McKinley is at 3702 East McKinley Avenue. Transportation will be provided for students living in the current Fawcett boundary.
