Martin Luther King, Jr Day---NO SCHOOL on January 18th (*NEW):

Please remember there will be no school on Monday, January 18th, to remember Martin Luther King, Jr.

Kindergarten Cohorts start this week (*NEW):

Welcome to our kindergarteners this coming week! We will see cohort A on Tuesday and cohort B on Thursday/Friday of this coming week. You should have received a detailed packet in the mail earlier last week with important information.

Please remember the daily health survey must be completed before arriving on campus. The easiest way to complete it is online through the Family App (see below). If you have not already registered, please do. Go to family.TPSAPPS.org to register. That is where you will take the survey.

For now, kindergarten students do not need to bring their laptops to school. They will mostly be focusing on learning classroom routines and getting to know their classmates in person.

If your child will take the bus, you can find their bus stop and schedule on our district website, www.tacomaschools.org. Please look for the bus icon and click into that page to insert your address. Then, be sure to contact our office to let us know your child's bus stop.

On school days when students do not attend school in person, they will have assignments from their teacher to work on independently. They may also watch live or recorded TPS TV School on YouTube, a series of 45-minute lessons taught by two Tacoma teachers for grades K-3. The lessons focus on math, literacy, and social-emotional activities by grade level.



Health Reminders:

Students must have their required immunizations to start in-person learning or related activities. Students who do not meet the immunization requirements by the first day of in-person learning will be excluded from school. Family App:

In past messages, I have told you about the Family App and all the features it offers. Now that more students will start coming back to school in person, it is more important than ever that you sign-up for it, if you haven't already. You will need the Family App to fill out the health survey every day your child comes to school. This is a critical step in our safety protocols.

Also, you can now get personalized access to information about your student in one place by logging into the newest version of our district's Family App.

On the upgraded site:

- You can monitor your child's attendance, including their last missed day of school, whether it's marked excused or unexcused
- You can look for extended learning opportunities
- You can create a custom calendar, tailored to the events at our school
- And you can take the COVID-19 health survey on days your child attends school in person.
- Coming soon, you will be able to view grades in the Family App as well.


Who: Any interested Fawcett Parents & Guardians

New Schoology Feature "Schoology Digest":

If you've created a family Schoology account, this week you'll start receiving an automated weekly digest of your child's work. It will include current grades, overdue assignments, upcoming assignments and recent activity in their account. If you haven't created your family Schoology account, I encourage you to do it. You'll be able to keep up with what your child is learning and how they're doing in school. Contact our school librarian to set up your account.

Completes one or more assignments

AND/OR

Attends one or more synchronous (live) meeting/lesson

Participates in activities planned by specialists: P.E., music and S.E.L.



Attends sychronous (live) lessons and actively participates

Responds to questions orally or via the chat box

AND

Turns camera on, in accordance with the classroom norms (as communicated by your child's teacher)

AND

Turns in completed work via Schoology or when necessary, using alternative means



Falcon Foundations for Success:


